On May 27th, members of the winemakers' club drove to the winery in Tinton Falls to crush our latest wine making experience. We are making a Chilean blend of Carmenere, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. The following Monday, June 3rd, we returned to press the grapes and pump the juice into our new wine barrel. This wine will take 9 months to mature and we will bottle it probably next March. There are a total of 31 hobbyists involved in this winemaking process; 17 have reserved a full case while 14 more have purchased 1/2 case each. The total cost per case is \$184. A small portion of the amount collected is used to produce the labels for our bottles. I thank Lou Fucito for helping with the development of the labels for printing and Ken Hekman along with his wife MaryBeth, who has designed magnificent designs for our labels. In August we plan to bottle our 2023 OPUS ONE blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Malbec.

I want to thank all the hobbyists who have participated over the years. On average, we have made two 60-gallon barrels each year. We have made many red wine blends including two Bordeaux, 5 Opus Ones, 3 Amarones, 3 Super Tuscans, 5 Chilean blends (including a Bordeaux blend) and a Pinot Noir and a Zinfandel Barbera. We began making wine back in 2012 as a club. Anyone who wants to participate please contact me as soon as you see one of these wine making emails. We sell out the barrel very quickly and our group participation in the steps necessary to make wine on the part of my fellow hobbyists has always been very popular.
