The Wine Appreciation Group (WAG), a long-standing Hobbyist activity, meets for lunch and wine tasting on a bi-monthly cycle, excluding July and August. Our luncheons are typically scheduled for the fourth Friday of every other month. The chairman and a committee composed of **Jim Cinquina** and **Jerry Schott** select an upscale Bergen County BYOB venue and negotiates a custom menu. Winemaking – Paul Richert, 201-967-1347, phriche7314@gmail.com. It has been a very busy year for the Hobbyist Winemakers' Club. We have been involved in three different 60gallon barrels this year alone. In May we crushed our 2024 Chilean Carmenere, Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot blend. In June 3rd we pressed these same grapes and pumped the juice into our 60-gallon wooden barrel. Thirty-one Hobbyists are involved in this winemaking project. It will be ready for bottling in February or March of 2025. All 60-gallon barrels yield 24 cases of wine representing 288 bottles per barrel. In August we "racked" the juice from the Chilean blend. To rack the fermenting wine we pump the juice out of the barrel into a holding tank, turn the barrel over and insert a hose to thoroughly wash out the barrel with water. This removes any impurities as well as the remains of the skins, pits, etc. from the barrel. The wine is then pumped back into the barrel to continue the fermentation process. On the same day we bottled our 2023 Opus One blend. Thirty Hobbyists participated in preparing this barrel. This wine, as are all other wines made at the "Wine Experience" in Tinton Falls, was entered into the wine competition held annually by the "Wine Experience." It was awarded a DOUBLE GOLD MEDAL. In order to earn a double gold rating all 5 American Wine tasters Association members who judge the wine must award it a gold medal. Only about 5 % of all wines made at the winery earn this commendation.

In October we started a new 60-gallon barrel. This time we made a Cabernet Sauvignon and Barbera blend. In November we pressed the grapes and began the fermentation process. Twenty-six Hobbyists are participating in this winemaking activity.

My sincere thanks go out to Lou Fucito and Ken Hekman, fellow winemakers. Lou has designed the labels for our bottles for a few years now. Ken's wife, Marybeth, has designed a number of our wine labels. They are truly beautiful works of art.

Finally, thank you to the Hobbyists for supporting activities such as ours. Since 2011, the Winemakers' Club has been creating some wonderful wine blends. Over the years, I estimate that over 100 different Hobbyists have been involved in the process. I am grateful to the Hobbyists (and by extension First Presbyterian Church) for supporting activities such as ours. Thank you to all.
